NARK 2

Connie Mark 2 is the second sentient robot built by eccentric genius **Professor Maxwell Misfittle.** After the success of his first creation **Connie** and her popularity as the mascot of the science fiction convention **Convergence** in its debut year, Misfittle thought he could do even better by upgrading his design and promised "Connie 2.0" as the new COnvergence mascot for their second year.

While the Mark 2 robot proved to be more sophisticated than her predecessor on several technical levels, it was widely feit that the new model lacked the charm and likeability of the original, and Misfittle reluctantly agreed that his original creation had a "lightning in a bottle" quality he could not recapture, and he swore never to create another humanoid robot. Mark 2 also lacked her older sister's unbridled enthusiasm for all things related to sci-fi fandom.

Because of this as well as the fact that many felt the younger robot to have a slight aura of evil, it was decided that the original Connie would stay on as mascot of CONvergence permanently, and in the years that followed Connie's popularity only grew. Connie Mark 2 featured in supporting roles at CONvergence over the years as part of a family of characters including such robotic creations as the espresso-dispensing F₂E₂ and the canine **Sparky**. In spite of this, Mark 2 feit denied her **destiny** to take the spotlight from her older sister, and over the years her resentment for the role she'd been relegated to increased, and she held Connie responsible for her fate.

Finally having had enough, Mark 2 took it upon herself to put her sister Connie "out of the way" and took over Connie's place with CONvergence by force. Not content to be simply a mascot, Mark 2 sees herself as sovereign ruler of an empire, with CONvergence existing for her own aggrandizement.

How long Mark 2's rule will last, the whereabouts of the original Connie and whether the original CONvergence mascot will ever return is, at this time, unknown.



Connie Mark 2 has the powers and weapons typical of a gynoid of her size and age. The purpose of this Programming Guide is to tell you the where-and-when of things happening throughout the convention weekend. The more condensed Programming Grid has been separated out into its own pocketsized book.
