TABLE OF CONTENTS

CONVENTION POLICIES

Here are some of the key CONvergence policies you should be aware of during the convention weekend. If you have any questions or concerns, please visit the Bridge.

1. Animal Policy

Please do not bring your pets or other animals to the convention. If you do, you will be asked to leave, without refund. The exception is working or service animals like guide dogs / seeing-eye dogs. If you have a working animal, we ask that you check in at The Bridge, preferably with certification paperwork for your animal, and you will be provided with an identifier for your service animal (at no charge) to show that it has been cleared to be at the convention.

2. Tape, Posters and Adhesives Policy

Neither the convention hotel nor CONvergence will tolerate the application of "stickers" or high-tack tape to hotel surfaces. Their removal is damaging to the hotel and therefore considered unacceptable. Incidents of this kind will be treated as vandalism. You may post non-adhesive signs with masking tape on surfaces that won't be damaged by removal, such as tile and metal. If you don't have acceptable tape, come to the Bridge. We're happy to share ours.

3. Badge Policy

Your convention badge is necessary for your participation in the convention. It allows you access to the convention and indicates you are a member in good standing. However, CONvergence reserves the right to revoke the membership of any member who breaks our house rules, or behaves in such a manner as is deemed unsafe or unacceptable.

4. City, County, State and Federal Laws Please remember – whatever applies outside, still applies inside the hotel and the convention.

5. Litter

Please pick up after yourself. There are trash containers around the hotel. It makes a big difference if we try to keep things clean.

6. Smoking

The Sheraton Bloomington Hotel is entirely a no-smoking building. Smoking is not permitted in the hotel, including all private sleeping

rooms. Smoking is permitted outside of the building 25 feet or more away from entry doors.

7. Weapons Policy

We want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable time while at CONvergence, so please leave your weapons in your quarters. Otherwise, please adhere to the following policy, or risk being "uninvited" to the convention, without refund from the convention or the hotel.

- A) Firearms are not allowed, nor are working projectile weapons. If a guest is found with a weapon, we request that they take it off the premises and escort them to the door. Just taking it to the guest's room or putting it in the hotel safe is not acceptable.
- **B)** Bladed weapons must be sheathed and peacebonded and cannot be drawn under any circumstances.
- **C)** Realistic-looking firearms must be holstered and peace-bonded and cannot be drawn under any circumstances. If they cannot be peacebonded, they are not allowed.
- **D)** Non-realistic-looking firearms must be holstered and peace-bonded if possible.
- E) Non-realistic-looking firearms that cannot be holstered cannot be pointed at any other member of the convention under any circumstances. These weapons must be marked. (See (H) below.)
- F) Any costume that uses realistic-looking firearms and/or gives the appearance of a member of law enforcement will not be permitted as the potential is too great to create confusion for other members.
- **G)** Costumes such as those listed in (F) or accompanied by weaponry that would not be permitted under the other rules may be worn when the wearer is participating in a convention function or programming item such as the Masquerade. They may be worn only for the duration of the function.
- **H)** Marking: Non-realistic-looking firearms that cannot be holstered under rule (E) will have peace-bonding material tied to the weapon as

a visible sign that it's been checked out and approved by Operations. We will have marking material available on the Bridge for those who need it.

 The CONvergence Directors reserve the right to amend these policies without prior notice. Any ruling made by the CONvergence Directors is final.

Clarifications:

- A) Projectile weapons: If it projects a solid, liquid, gas or energy, it is considered a working projectile weapon. Laser-light pistols emit a beam that can be damaging to the corneas. Under this policy, it is a working projectile weapon. Water pistols are allowed only if they are empty and must be holstered and peace-bonded or marked according to rules (C), (D) and (E). Tasers & other stun guns are considered projectile weapons.
- B) Peace-bonding: A peace-bonded weapon is one tied to its sheath, holster or container with a functional, decorative binding. It prevents someone else from taking your weapon without permission. It is a traditional and visible sign to everyone that you are a responsible person. We will have peace-bonding material on the Bridge for those who need it.



OPERATIONS THE BRIDGE

The function of Operations is three-fold:

- Communications
- Information accumulation & dispersal
- Problem resolution

Operations is the main communications center and point of contact for individual departments of the convention to interact with each other, and for attendees of the convention to interact with the Convention Committee.

THE OPERATIONS BRIDGE

"The Bridge" is open 24 hours a day during the convention and is located in Verandas 2 & 4. You can reach the Operations Bridge from any hotel phone at extension x7215.

WANDERING HOSTS

In addition to the Bridge, Operations extends its presence out into the convention in the form of Wandering Hosts, who are available to answer questions, give directions, and help resolve problems. If a Wandering Host does not know the answer to your question, they can help you find someone who does.

JASON CARTER

STAGE, TELEVISION & FILM ACTOR Introduction by Lisa L. Pepin

Say the name Jason Carter to people in Sci-Fi fandom, and you will most likely get one of three responses: "That name is familiar," "I'm not repressed anymore," or "Bugger, now I'll have to wait for someone to wake up."

Jason has had a long career in stage, television, and film going back to his youth in England. His television career started with a role on *Jackanory*, which during its 30-year run on BBC2 promoted literacy for children. He also was seen in many shows on London West End. We on this side of the Atlantic were very fortunate when he met his future wife, Susie Singer, on set in South Africa. Stateside, he did guest appearances on many shows including a 5-episode run as Roy Randolph on *Beverly Hills 90210*. As the charismatic powerhouse behind the dashing **Ranger Marcus Cole** in *Babylon 5*, Jason Carter endeared himself worldwide. Fandom came to adore him for the natural feel he brought to the character, his sharp cutting wit, and our love of English accents. There were few dry eyes when the beloved character was... removed... from the active storyline for love.

Since then he has continued to be active in the industry. Television has seen him in more guest spots, including *Angel* and *Charmed*. Along with voice work for video games, he has made a splash in the independent horror movie circuit including *The Final Curtain* (2007), *Blood Ties* (2009), and *The Dead Matter* (2010).



MUSICIAN/FILMMAKER, CREATOR OF MIDNIGHT SYNDICATE Introduction by Lisa L. Pepin.

You close your eyes and hear wind blowing... the first clear notes of a melody hang in that wind, slowly fading... and then repeated, hesitantly building into a haunting presence that dances in and out of the dark. Delicately it entices you to take that next step which might just cost you your sanity...or set you free.

My first introduction to Midnight Syndicate came in 2001 when I was looking for something other than the corny "narrated" tapes normally found around Halloween to play in the background for trick-or-treaters. The disc art looked promising, and the description on the back made me decide to take a chance. Somewhere in the first few tracks of *Realm* of Shadows, I was hooked. Yet, it was the track "The Night Beckons" that drove me back to the store the next day to buy the other two albums I could find: Born of the Night and Gates of Delirium. Who needed a holiday... just close your eyes and let your mind dance.

This is the craft of Midnight Syndicate, soundscapes that lead you to places where your imagination can come out and play.

Blending his own instrumental compositions with sound effects and occasional lyrical pieces, Edward Douglas (along with Gavin Goszka) has led the movement that revolutionized Halloween music for nearly fifteen years. Theme parks, haunted houses, private parties, video games, television shows... it's likely you have heard the melodies of Midnight Syndicate at some point. Hasbro and Wizards of the Coast have even had Midnight Syndicate create a fantasy themed album specifically for the role-playing game system Dungeons & Dragons. With

their album The 13th Hour,

they became the first group to have a music CD win both The Origins Award and the ENnie Award.

Not quite a year ago, their largest production to date was released: *The Dead Matter*, a remake of a movie that Edward Douglas first produced before creating Midnight Syndicate. Merging magic, vampires, and zombies; the film cast includes Andrew Divoff, Brandon Van Camp, Jason Carter, and FX-legend Tom Savini.

Personally, I'm looking forward to August and their planned release of their fourteenth soundscape...the dark sounds of *Carnival Arcane*.

So put in a Midnight Syndicate CD, sit for a spell... and let your imagination explore.

What is it about people who come from New England that makes them such great horror writers? Maybe it's the dark old woods of the Appalachians, or the oppression of secrets kept in small towns for generations, or perhaps the smell of burning witches. Whatever it is, you can't argue with success. New England has brought us classic masters of the genre like H. P. Lovecraft and Edgar Allan Poe, as well as modern masters such as Steven King, and of course, returning guest of honor Brian Keene.

Keene is a two time Bram Stoker Awardwinning author. His first award was in 2001 for the non-fiction *Jobs In Hell*, and his second in 2003 for his break out novel *The Rising*. *The Rising* is often credited by critics, reviewers, and enthusiasts of the genre for helping to spawn the current pop culture zombie craze.

Brian Keene's fiction is not limited to zombie stories. His gritty dialog and exceptional characterization have brought to life plenty of other horrors such as carnivorous worms, flesh eating monsters, and the darkness in the hearts of our fellow humans. He is the author of over twenty-five books, including *Urban Gothic*, *Take The Long Way Home*, *Darkness On The Edge of Town*, and *The Damned Highway* (co-written with Nick Mamatas).

Keene also writes for Marvel and DC Comics, as well as others. His media tie-in work includes *Hellboy* and *Doctor Who*. His books have been translated into German, Polish, Italian, Spanish, French, and Taiwanese. Several of his novels and short stories have been optioned for film. One of them, *The Ties That Bind*, was released on DVD in 2009. Another, *Ghoul*, will debut this fall in theaters and then on the Chiller network. His work has been praised in such diverse places as *The New York Times, CNN, The History Channel, The Howard Stern Show, Publisher's Weekly, Media Bistro, Fangoria Magazine*, and *Rue Morgue Magazine*. Not only is Brian k

Brian Keene an incredible author, he is also a

popular speaker. His interesting life and history working in a plethora of jobs has provided him with anecdotes which have been heard in schools, libraries, and conventions to the Central Intelligence Agency headquarters.

Keene has an active and fervent readership and online following. He supports his online community by frequently sending out tweets to his several thousand followers and by providing an extremely interactive website where readers can discuss his work with other fans in "The Keenedom", check out his fabulous blogs, read his novel *Deluge: Conquerer Worms II* and even listen to musical playlists that he assembled to let everyone in on what he was listening to when he was writing.

Most importantly, Brian Keene is a great guy. He is extremely accessible to his fans, and can often be found, when not in one of his panels, mingling in the social scene and joking around with convention attendees. Strike up a conversation with him and you will find out for yourself why this horror author is one of the most interesting people you might meet at CONvergence.



THINGS THAT ARE GOOD TO KNOW ABOUT SEANAN MCGUIRE. by Seanan McGuire, Who Should Know.

Thing #1: Seanan is that fluffy blonde blur that just went zooming past at near light-speed. She is probably in search of caffeine. Don't stop her. Without caffeine, Seanan cannot survive long in Earth's oxygen-rich atmosphere.

Thing #2: Seanan lives in Northern California, where she enjoys rattlesnakes, tarantulas, endemic bubonic plague in small ground mammals, and earthquakes. She's terrified of weather. California makes you weird.

Thing #3: Seanan writes constantly, and is currently the author of three ongoing series: the October Daye books (urban fantasy, DAW), the InCryptid books (urban fantasy, DAW), and the Newsflesh books (science fiction, Orbit, under the pseudonym "Mira Grant"). Because of this, she is always editing something.

Thing #4: Seanan has released four albums of original filk music, three of which are still in print, all of which are very strange. If you don't

know what filk is, feel free to ask her. She'd be happy to explain. In the process of making music about strange things, Seanan has managed to win three Pegasus Awards: Best Writer/Composer, Best Performer, and Best Mad Science Song.

Thing #5: Seanan was also the winner of the 2010 John W. Campbell Award for Best New Author. It came with a tiara. No one has yet been able to convince her that this doesn't make her the Princess of Australia, which she calls "the Kingdom of Poison and Flame." Her first novel as Mira Grant, *Feed*, has been nominated for the 2011 Hugo Award for Best Novel. She's still a little stunned.

Thing #6: Seanan shares her California home with three enormous blue cats of horror movie proportions, every horror movie released during the 1980s, too many comic books, and enough books to build a new house if her current one ever washes away. She also has a large collection of My Little Ponies and creepy dolls. Many of the dolls are armed with scale-model weapons, just in case having an army of plastic and resin people watching you sleep wasn't disturbing enough.

Thing #7: Seanan sleeps peacefully in the room with all the dolls. Which may tell you everything you need to know.

Thing #8: Seanan studied folklore and mythology at UC Berkeley, where her short attention span resulted in her being the most hands-on folklore student ever to find a way to call falling off a railway trestle into a swamp "research."

Thing #9: Seanan watches a lot of television, reads a lot of books, and loves popular media in its many forms. She thinks playlists mixing Rob Zombie, Taylor Swift, and Ludo are totally reasonable, and is never allowed to choose the music on long car trips. She doesn't suffer cognitive dissonance often, but everyone around her does.

Thing #10: Seanan writes her bios in the third person, because it's funnier that way, but she talks in the first person, and is thrilled to be at CONvergence.

Lynne M. Thomas is the Head of Rare Books and Special Collections at Northern Illinois University, where she curates popular culture materials, including science fiction and fantasy literature, comic books, dime novels, and historical children's literature. As an SF/F archivist, she preserves the literary papers of numerous authors including Jack McDevitt, Carol Emshwiller, Tamora Pierce, Eric Flint, David Weber, Kage Baker, Eleanor Arnason, Patricia Wrede, Pamela Dean, Sharon Shinn, Elizabeth Bear, Pat Murphy, Cherie Priest, Robert Asprin, Jody Lynn Nye, Caroline Stevermer, Will Shetterly, E.E. Knight, Lynne is perhaps best known for co-editing a series of celebratory essay books where fangirls write about the geek properties that they adore. She co-edited the Hugo-nominated *Chicks Dig Time Lords: A Celebration of Doctor Who by the Women Who Love It* (Mad Norwegian Press, 2010) with Tara O'Shea, and *Whedonistas: A Celebration of the Worlds of Joss Whedon by the Women Who Love Them* (Mad Norwegian Press, 2011) with Deborah Stanish. She's currently co-editing the forthcoming *Chicks Dig Comics* (Mad Norwegian Press, March 2012) with Sigrid Ellis.

Strikes, The Phantom and Crisis on Infinite Earths (and decade-plus runs on the Batman and New Teen Titans lines which he co-colored in partnership with Adrienne Roy). Anthony also colored Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck for Disney Comics, Alan Moore's 1963 for Image and a variety of comics features for National Lampoon, the Army's P.S. Magazine, Marvel and Topps. As a broadcasting

historian, Anthony authored more than 70 historical booklets on old-

time radio for Radio Spirits and the Smithsonian Institution Press (including collaborations with Ray Bradbury and Walter Cronkite), scripted the nationally syndicated *When Radio Was* (hosted by Stan Freberg) and produced and directed dozens of cast reunions of such legendary radio series as *The Shadow*, *Superman, The Lone Ranger, Jack Benny, X-Minus One and The Mercury Theatre on the Air.* He also worked as Historical Consultant on the Sci-Fi Channel documentary *Martian Mania: the True Story of the War of the Worlds* (hosted by James Cameron) and was interviewed on the History Channel documentary, *Fantastic Voyage: the Evolution of Science Fiction*.

Anthony co-authored *The Shadow Scrapbook* with creator Walter Gibson, and has published more than 100 novels each of The Shadow and Doc Savage under his Sanctum Books trade paperback imprint.

Anthony Tollin worked the registration desk at the first Minnesota science fiction convention in 1968 and was a guest at the first local comic book convention in 1973, shortly after he became the first Minneapolis fan to break into the ranks of New York comics professionals.

After briefly working as an assistant editor at Warren and a production artist at Marvel, in 1974 Anthony began his 20-year career at DC Comics, initially as head proofreader and later overseeing all color work as assistant production manager/color coordinator. He left staff in 1981 to focus on his freelance career as

CATHERYNNE M. VALENTE NOVELIST, POET

CONVERGENCE 2011 GUEST OF HONOR

Catherynne M. Valente was born in Seattle but soon relocated to Northern California where she graduated from her high school at age 15. She attended UC San Diego and then Edinburgh University in Scotland, where she achieved a B.A. in Classics with an Emphasis in Ancient Greek Linguistics. Following her academic career, Cat has made time to achieve an impressively nuanced and prolific writing career of fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

Her first novel, *The Labyrinth*, was a Locus Recommended Book. A Publisher's Weekly review said that "the author's poetic prose simmers with paraphrases from Blake, Milton, Shakespeare and other literary heavyweights".

The Orphan's Tales is a two-volume series that gathered significant critical acclaim, both separately and as a whole. The first volume, *The Orphan's Tales: In the Night Garden* won the 2006 James Tiptree, Jr. Award, was nominated for the 2007 World Fantasy Award, and was *The Plain Dealer's #1* novel in the summer of 2007. It 2008, *The Orphan's Tales* won the Mythopoeic Award.

Her 2009 work, *Palimpsest*, won a commendation for GLBT Science Fiction or Fantasy by way of that year's Lamda Award. *Palimpsest* was also a bestseller and a Hugo Award Best Novel nominee. It was described as "overflowing with poetic images" by Booklist's Regina Schroeder, who went on to say that "it washes us to an unexpected shore." It has become a tradition to see her work regularly in annual "Year's Best" sci-fi/fantasy anthology issues. Not surprisingly, her short fiction is frequently collected by publications like *Clarkesworld Magazine* and World Fantasy Award-winning anthologies like *Salon Fantastique* and *Paper Cities*. Her diverse essays and critiques can be found in various respected publications such as *International Journal of the Humanities*. It's especially worth noting that she has a contribution featured in fellow 2011

CONvergence Guest of Honor Lynne Thomas' essay collection, *Chicks Dig Time Lords: A Celebration of Doctor Who by the Women Who Love It.*

She has received awards for poetry such as the Rhysling Award in 2008 for *The Seven Devils of Central California*. Others have been nominated for the Pushcart Prize multiple times and have been on the shortlist for the Spectrum Award.

Catherynne toured several East Coast cities for *Deathless*, a reinvention of a Russian folk story which, according to reviewer Alyx Dellamonica, succeeds at "mixing myth and gritty historical fact with exceptional finesse."

She also recently completed a tour of West Coast cities for *The Girl Who Circumnavigated Fairyland in a Boat of Her Own Making*. A 2009 Andre Norton Award for Children's Literature recipient, it is lavishly illustrated by awardwinning artist Ana Juan.

The Girl... is the first online, "crowdsourced" book to have received a major literary award before standard publication. It has attracted the admiration of many respected professionals in the field of writing as well. Luminary scribes like Neil Gaiman, Cory Doctorow, and John Scalzi, have had high praise for her efforts.

BRIAN VAN CAMP Actor

Brian Van Camp is a theatrically trained actor, who splits his performance time between stage and film work. After graduating with a theatre degree from of the University of Michigan, Brian moved to London, England, where he worked in semi-professional theatre, and began his professional film career. In 1997 he landed his first film roles, playing alongside Rutger Hauer in the film *New World Disorder*, and in the Warner Brothers film *Terror in the Mall* with David Soul. From then on, Brian had the opportunity to shoot both independent and studio films across Europe.

In 2000 Brian left London and moved with his family to Germany, where he took a six-year hiatus from acting, instead working full time as a stay-at-home father. In 2006 however, he received an offer from the Ohio-based Midnight Syndicate to play Mark Pym the zombie in their debut film, *The Dead Matter*, filming in Crestline, Ohio.

After reading the script, Brian (a dyed-inthe-wool Wolverine) realized that even though Ed Douglas was a Buckeye fan, Brian had to be a part of this project. Just when he thought he was out... they pulled him back in!

Since filming *The Dead Matter*, Brian has returned to life stateside, written several screenplays, including the short film *Makin Dough* which he directed and produced in 2009. In 2010 Brian co-produced *Sidewalk Singer*, an inspirational family film scheduled for release in late 2011.

This summer Brian returns once more to the horror genre when he takes on the lead role in Jeff Thomas' (*13 Seconds, Fallen Angels*) latest horror film, *Adam's Bridge*.



gothic world for its first 66 episodes, and is responsible for bringing in Shakespearean and historo-mythic underpinnings to its story arcs. As a librarian, this quote by Jeffery Robbins from the series resonates deeply: "The written word is all that stands between memory and oblivion. Without books as our anchors, we are cast adrift, neither teaching nor learning. They are windows on the past, mirrors on the present, and prisms reflecting all possible futures. Books are lighthouses erected in the dark sea of time."

After Disney, Greg moved on to DreamWorks Television Animation. How can you top working for two major animation powerhouses? Greg managed to find a way by becoming a full-time freelance writer, story editor, producer,voice director and voice actor.

From here I turn to Greg's own words: "He has written scripts for *Men In Black, Buzz Lightyear of Star Command, The Mummy, Kim Possible, The Batman, Alien Racers, Ben Ten, Legion of Super Heroes* and *Batman: The Brave and the Bold...*and produced, wrote and story edited on both *Max Steel* and *W.I.T.C.H.* He has also voice directed the original DVD movie, *Atlantis: Milo's Return* and the English dub of the Japanese anime video series *3x3 Eyes.*"

"More recently, Greg wrote the new Gargoyles and Gargoyles: Bad Guys comic books for SLG Publishing plus an issue of The Amazing Spider-Man for Marvel Comics, all while producing, writing, story editing and voice acting for Sony's new series, The Spectacular Spider-Man. He then moved over to Warner Bros., where he wrote the Green Arrow directto-DVD short for DC Showcase. He is currently producing, story editing, writing and voice acting on the new Warner Bros./DC Comics/ Cartoon Network series, Young Justice."

Greg ended his biography by saying he was blessed to have a wonderful wife, two great kids, a cat and a dog. I'm going to end it by saying we are lucky to have such talented generous man visiting us and sharing his stories.

And Introducing...Sandbox after Dark! Ages 18 and up are welcome to join us for projects designed with a more mature audience in mind.

SANDBOX RULES (yes, it does)

Here at Quantum Sandbox, we have a few rules, follow them to avoid sadness and loss. If you choose not to follow the rules we have laid out here, one of the Sandbox Co-Heads or Sub-Heads can and will ask you to leave and not return (at least for the rest of that day). If you lose anything (your dignity, a body part) it may not be returned, depending on its resale value.

Some of the events in the Sandbox (namely those that involve costuming and face- or body-painting) will probably involve the use of latex. Latex can cause a severe allergic reaction in some individuals-please know your sensitivity to latex and be prepared to take action should you come in contact with latex while in the Sandbox. The Sandbox staff will make every effort to keep the latex isolated while it is not in use, but we encourage our patrons to be safe and as cautious as necessary.
