Policies & Procedures

1. Adhesives Used for Posts and Stickers: **One True Tape**

Neither the convention hotel nor CONvergence will tolerate the application of stickers or high-tack tape to hotel surfaces. Their removal is damaging to the hotel, and therefore considered unacceptable. Incidents of this kind will be treated as vandalism.

You may post non-adhesive signs with low-tack tape; we specify and require only beige masking tape, on surfaces that won't be damaged by removal, such as tile and metal. If you don't have acceptable tape, come to the Bridge. We're happy to share ours.

2. Badge Policy

Your convention badge is necessary for your participation in the convention. It allows you access to the convention and indicates you are a member in good standing. However, CONvergence reserves the right to revoke the membership of any member who breaks our house rules, or behaves in such a manner as is deemed unsafe or unacceptable.

3. City, County, State and Federal Laws

Please remember - whatever applies outside, still applies inside the hotel and the convention.

4. Litter

Please pick up after yourself. There are trash containers around the hotel. It makes a big difference if we try to keep things clean.

5. Smoking

Due to Bloomington city law the entire hotel is now non-smoking. The only place that smoking is allowed is outside of the hotel at a distance of 25 feet of any entrances. The CONsuite and cabanas are NOT smoking areas. Smoking on the patios and balconies of the rooms is not allowed.

6. Anti-Harassment

CONvergence is dedicated to providing a safe and comfortable convention experience for everyone. Harassment of any kind, including physical assault, battery, deliberate intimidation, stalking, or unwelcome physical attentions, will not be tolerated. If people tell you "no" or to leave them alone, your business with them is done.

Leave them alone. Do not follow them or attempt to disrupt their convention experience in any way. If you continue to attempt to have contact with those people, you may be removed from the premises.

CONvergence is not responsible for solving any interpersonal problems that may arise between individual members. In general, we can take no action to prevent a person from attending the convention unless that person has made a specific and credible threat toward the convention itself. If you feel that a threat exists against your person, we advise you to seek a restraining order against the individual in question and to involve the host hotel itself (security staff specifically) and the municipal police department in advance of the convention; otherwise, we recommend simply avoiding that individual.

If that individual stalks, harasses, or attempts to assault you at the convention itself, you may report that individual to a member of Operations (they will report it to the hotel's security staff who will get the police involved if necessary) or you may report it to hotel security directly, and the appropriate action will be taken. Conversely, any attempt to have an innocent person removed from the convention by falsely accusing him or her of threats will be itself treated as an act of harassment and will be dealt with appropriately. The responsibility for settling interpersonal disputes lies solely with the individuals involved, and CONvergence will not tolerate being used as a leveraging point in such disputes.

7. Weapons Policy

We want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable time while at CONvergence, so please leave your weapons in your quarters. Otherwise, please adhere to the following policy, or risk being uninvited to the convention, without refund from the convention or the hotel. We really don't want to do that, so please take notice, as some of the rules may have changed!

- A) Firearms are not allowed, period. Nor are working projectile weapons.
- B) Bladed weapons must be sheathed and peace-bonded and cannot be drawn under any circumstances.

- J) CONvergence reserves the right to deem any item unsafe or inadmissible, regardless of whether it conforms to the 'letter of the law'. The safety of our guests is our No.1 concern.
- K) Violations of this policy can lead to ejection and/or banning from all future Convergence Events functions and/or legal action.
- L) The Convergence Events Board of Directors reserves the right to amend these policies without prior notice. Any ruling made by the Board of Directors is final.

If you find an object that seems to be missing it's owner, please bring it to the Bridge so that we may inventory the item and secure it in hopes of returning it to its forlorn guardian.

If you have lost an object and are now forlorn because of this, please come to the Bridge. We will check our inventory to see if another kind convention member has found it and we will return it to you after a few questions to authenticate your guardianship of said item. If we have not yet had your item turned in to us, we will make an entry into our Lost and Found software to match up against a later retrieval by a fellow convention member.

You'd be surprised how many lost, lonely, objects get turned in by your fellow, very conscientious convention members as well as how many items are never reunited with their owners.

9. Animal Policy

Pets are not allowed at CONvergence. This means NO dogs, cats, birds, ferrets, snakes, banthas, etc. While one pet is usually not a problem, we would soon have many pet related problems if we allowed them.

The DoubleTree has a policy that allows pets. However, during the convention they have agreed to follow our policy.

Effective March 15th 2011, the Federal ADA definition of "service animal" has changed. For the final rule published, please go to the ADA website: *http://www.ada.gov/ regs2010/titlell_2010/reg2_2010.html*

CONvergence follows this final ruling and its clarifications. For this print version of the Operations Manual, information from the above links is appended at the end of this policy or are within this policy, but are not as fully comprehensive as what is online.

Key changes include the following:

- 1. Only dogs or small ponies (not kidding!) will be recognized as service animals.
- 2. Service animals are required to be leashed or harnessed except when performing work or tasks where such tethering would interfere with the animal's ability to perform.
- **3.** Service animals are exempt from breed bans as well as size and weight limitations.
- **4.** Though not considered service animals, businesses are generally required to accommodate the use of miniature horses under specific conditions.

Existing policies that were clarified or formalized include the following:

- Dogs whose sole function is "the provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship" are not considered service dogs under the ADA.
- 2. The use of service dogs for psychiatric and neurological disabilities is explicitly protected under the ADA. (Please note: the above website clearly defines that a service animal for psychiatric and neurological disorders must be trained to "do work" and "perform tasks". Please see the section titled Doing "Work" or Performing "Tasks"

contained within the definition of Service Animal, located in Subpart A—General, Section 35.104 Definitions. for a clear definition of what this entails.)

3. The "crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence" do not qualify that animal as a service animal and "an animal individually trained to provide aggressive protection, such as an attack dog, is not appropriately considered a service animal."

If your service dog meets these requirements, it will be issued a Service Animal Badge from Registration once verified by the Bridge. The next immediate step is to report to the Bridge with the service dog to check in for the weekend so that you and your service animal have as few interruptions as possible by staff verifying that you've complied with the policy. We look forward to having you both at our convention and will do our best to work with you to make the experience the best it can be for everyone!

Service animal means any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. Other species of animals, whether wild or domestic, trained or untrained, are not service animals for the purposes of this definition. The work or tasks performed by a service animal must be directly related to the handler's disability. Examples of work or tasks include, but are not limited to, assisting individuals who are blind or have low vision with navigation and other tasks, alerting individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, providing non-violent protection or rescue work, pulling a wheelchair, assisting an individual during a seizure, alerting individuals to the presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine or the telephone, providing physical support and assistance with balance and stability to individuals with mobility disabilities, and helping persons with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive behaviors. The crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence and the provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks for the purposes of this definition.

§ 35.136 Service animals

- a) **General.** Generally, a public entity shall modify its policies, practices, or procedures to permit the use of a service animal by an individual with a disability.
- b) Exceptions. A public entity may ask an individual with a disability

to remove a service animal from the premises if--

- 1) The animal is out of control and the animal's handler does not take effective action to control it; or
- 2) The animal is not housebroken.
- c) If an animal is properly excluded. If a public entity properly excludes a service animal under § 35.136(b), it shall give the individual with a disability the opportunity to participate in the service, program, or activity without having the service animal o the premises.
- d) Animal under handler's control. A service animal shall be under the control of its handler. A service animal shall have a harness, leash, or other tether, unless either the handler is unable because of a disability to use a harness, leash, or other tether, or the use of a harness, leash, or other tether would interfere with the service animal's safe, effective performance of work or tasks, in which case the service animal must be otherwise under the handler's control (e.g., voice control, signals, or other effective means).
- e) Care or supervision. A public entity is not responsible for the care or supervision of a service animal.
- f) Inquiries. A public entity shall not ask about the nature or extension of a person's disability, but may make two inquiries to determine whether an animal qualifies as a service animal. A public entity may ask if the animal is required because of a disability and what work or task the animal has been trained to perform. A public entity shall not require documentation, such as proof that the animal has been certified, trained, or licensed as a service animal. Generally, a public entity may not make these inquiries about a service animal when it is readily apparent that an animal is trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability (e.g., the dog is observed guiding an individual who is blind or has low vision, pulling a person's wheelchair, or providing assistance with stability or balance to an individual with an observable mobility disability).
- g) Access to areas of a public entity. Individuals with disabilities shall be permitted to be accompanied by their service animals in all areas of a public entity's facilities where members of the public, participants in services, programs or activities, or invitees as relevant, are allowed to go.
- h) Surcharges. A public entity shall not ask or require an individual with a disability to pay a surcharge, even if people accompanied by pets are required to pay fees, or to comply with other requirements generally not applicable to people without pets. If a public entity normally charges individuals for the damage they cause, a individual with a disability may be charged for damage caused be his or her service animal.



WHAT DO YOU SAY TO A NAKED LADY IN AN ELEVATOR?

The world of fandom operates much like any culture – societies devote a great deal of time and much of their resources to the establishment and maintenance of rules of conduct. Our cultural rules differ from those of "normal" society, but even for fans, a complex system of rules exists to help us determine our behavior as a part of the community. While some of our rules are more stringent and others more lenient, it is important that we effectively explain them to newcomers wanting to be a part of our society, so that everyone can have a good time at the convention.

Hyperbolic anecdotes are a key tool for helping new fans understand the rules of our society. Consider the following: You call for an elevator, it opens, and there is a woman standing there alone wearing nothing more than a strong sense of self-confidence. Waiting for another elevator seems uncalled for, so you get in. You are now together in a small room and naturally, your impulse is to make conversation. Unfortunately, you forgot your pocket book of nudity etiquette, and you find yourself wondering, "What do you say to a naked lady in an elevator?"

"Hello, Naked Lady."

Whatever you choose to say, be polite and try to be nice. These are rules we learned in kindergarten, although Mrs. Rudy probably never thought you'd apply them to a conversation with someone guilty of public nudity. Being friendly can't hurt either, but don't be too friendly. Remember, you have no idea why this person is naked in an elevator. Her nudity may not be intended as a sexual statement, and, even if it is, you may not be the person to whom she intends to speak. Besides, there's more to life than sex (really!), so feel free to talk about something else: books, politics, how the con is going, religion, the weather, the elevator décor...

"Gee, that badge must hurt."

It is perfectly acceptable to ask about someone's costume, their design choices, the technical challenges involved, and so forth. Most costumers and other over-dressers love these questions, although some may simply wish to keep their trade secrets to themselves.

"Mind if I take a picture of your...costume?"

It is always OK to ask if you may take a picture. More often than not the answer is "Yes!" – after all, most of us dress up to show off, right? However, *always* ask before shoving that telephoto lens down somebody's cleav...err...throat.

"I want you to know that I find your costume/lack thereof personally offensive."

As a community, we pride ourselves on being both inclusive and progressive on social issues; in fact, CONvergence policy forbids discrimination on the grounds of genetic background or planet of origin. However, the CONvergence committee firmly believes in freedom of expression, and we are not now, nor have we ever been politically correct. So, while it is perfectly acceptable to disagree with somebody and to express that disagreement, remember that you are responsible for your own behavior. If you offend someone, you will have to deal with the consequences of that choice.

"Honk, honk!"

Unless you are close friends with the Naked Lady, this is a very bad reaction. Animal impulses don't have a public place in any society, ours included. There are plenty of ways to appreciate any sort of costume or outfit you may see – drooling like an adolescent male isn't one of them.

"Lose something?"

Tastefully expressing that you find someone attractive is a sincere and honest form of flattery. Remember, though, that people say the word "no" in many different ways, and any way they say it, "no" always means "no."

Whether this is your first CONvergence or you're a convention veteran, as a member of the fandom culture, you should know that you will encounter varying degrees of social aptitude throughout your weekend. While CONvergence is an opportunity for all of us to express ourselves through what we wear, what we say, and what we do, no one at CONvergence is entitled to make you feel threatened. If you do feel threatened, find a Wandering Host (of which there will be several, all wearing notable purple vests), a Party Host (because all room parties are Safe Zones), or the Bridge and report your concerns. You can also talk to anyone wearing a CONCom badge, and they will help you find assistance. If we all work together, we can make CONvergence a safe and happy place for everyone! Let's all work together to have a happy and safe Con for Naked Ladies (and the rest of us too)!



In Memoriam



tj starbuck by Ishmael Williams

We have lost several notables in the course of the past year, and one that hits particularly close to home is the passing of Tia Jeane' (TJ, or Teej) Starbuck. TJ served as the second president to the Minnesota Society For Interest In Science Fiction & Fantasy, aka MISFITS, now known as Geek Partnership Society (GPS). The founders of CONvergence convention had wanted not just to deliver a good convention year after year, but to also serve the community. MISFITS was created to do just that, and TJ stepped forward to help establish a solid foundation for the organization by serving as president. TJ also headed one of the earliest entertainment offerings during the first years of CONvergence, a guasi-gambling establishment called Phule's Club. TJ delved into her love for things Egyptian and helped fashioned the Egyptian themed hang-out. She worked for many years at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival as merchant class street character, and she achieved her long-time dream of becoming a published author. Her first book was self published, and she had just recently found an editor to represent her second offering. The publishing of this book, largely finished and in the process of final polishing, will be TJ's final legacy as on April 29, 2012, just a little over one month past her 50th birthday, she lost a three-year battle with cancer. She passed peacefully at the home she shared with long-time friend and sister Kat Pepmiller and her husband, Jay "Rusty" Curry. A ceremony for her life was held the day she passed, one which TJ herself had helped to plan. Many friends and family gathered to tell stories, to support one another, and to celebrate the friend and family member that TJ had always been to many.

Some of her books include The Star Wars Craft Book, You Can Draw: Star Wars, and Girls Against Girls: Why We Are Mean To Each Other and How We Can Change. Her geekiness is only further emphasized by participating in high profile projects such as Womanthology, appearing on Felicia Day's The Guild, and speaking on the SDCC panel "Oh You Sexy Geek." She has also been featured for her work in magazines like Geek Monthly,

Star Wars Insider, BUST, SFX, and WIRED.

In an industry that is often critiqued for being too male centric, Bonnie provides a great example of how a woman can excel and be recognized. Aside from all of her work, Bonnie's best feature is her personality and being accessible to fans. Whether it be from a workshop or a signing table, her convention appearances always result in comments of great interactions she has with fellow attendees.

She has lived & worked all over the U.S., with world-class stars like Angela Lansbury, Jason Robards, Annette Bening, John Goodman, James Earl Jones, Ray Bradbury, and many others. lyda morehouse Introduction by Naomi Kritzer

Lyda Morehouse was kidnapped by fairies as an infant and returned three days later with a note saying, "Thank you for showing us this baby, but she didn't quite grab us, alas." She consoled herself by attempting to become a superhero as a child, a Jedi Knight as a teen, and a vampire as a college student. When working at the Renaissance Festival failed to satisfy her needs, she resorted to writing science fiction and fantasy.

Deep in the recesses of her parents' basement, there are home movie reels of the *Star Trek* episodes she made with her cousin when they were ten. Filmed with a handheld camera (held by her cooperative father), Lyda's cousin played Kirk, Spock, and Scotty while Lyda played McCoy and the entire Red Shirt contingent. (She died very dramatically, many times.)

In the early 1990s, she took a Loft class on writing science fiction and fantasy, where she met Harry LeBlanc. The two of them started the Wyrdsmiths, which remains the most successful writers' group in the Twin Cities. Her big professional break came with Archangel Protocol, a post-apocalyptic cyberpunk dystopia with an oppressive theocracy & radical angels. Archangel Protocol was followed by Fallen Host, Messiah Node, & Apocalypse Array.

When her editor at Roc left, the series was orphaned. Lyda held a wake for her career, complete with a traditional Irish keen, single-malt Scotch, and a coffin filled with books. A few weeks later, her new editor suggested she switch to writing vampire novels, and appropriately enough-her career rose from the dead under a new identity.

As Tate Hallaway, she wrote *Tall, Dark and Dead*, which is still selling well and was just released in mass-market paperback. That was followed by Dead Sexy, Romancing the Dead, Dead If I Do, and Honeymoon of the Dead. The



Garnet Lacey series covers the adventures of the smartalecky, book-selling witch, Garnet, and her vampire boyfriend (fiancé, husband) Sebastian.

She followed this with the YA-oriented Vampire Princess of St. Paul series: Almost to Die For, Almost *Final Curtain*, and *Almost Everything*, which put a secret Vampire kingdom in the caves under St. Paul.

In the meantime, she wrote a follow-up to the Archangel Protocol series, Resurrection Code, which was published by Mad Norwegian Press. Most recently, she wrote Precinct 13, about a coroner in Pierre, South Dakota, whose first day takes a turn for the unexpected when the corpse she's autopsying grabs his liver and walks out of the room, scraping his toe-tag as he goes. (*Precinct 13* comes out in August.)

Lyda is also known in the community as a prolific mentor (having started her career with a class at the Loft, she now teaches there herself), a wildly enthusiastic fan (of comics, TV, movies, Anime...), and one of the most hilariously entertaining people you could ask for on your con programming, provided you fuel her up with coffee first.

RUTH THOMPSON Introduction by Ishmael William

Ruth began her artistic career as a young girl who, she was told, was "pretty good at drawing." In high

school she discovered

Dungeons and Dragons and never looked back. It was a world that captured her imagination, and in it she created knights and dragons and magical beings of every kind. When she had a chance, she went to her first science fiction and fantasy convention, called Continuity, in Birmingham, AL. Her sister and a friend convinced her to enter her drawings in the art show. Of the twelve pieces she entered, 7 were sold for the huge total of \$46.00. Ruth cherishes that memory.

Immediately following college, Ruth took to art full time, and has since produced illustrations for nearly every fantasy company that can be named, from collectible card games to magazines and books. After a while, she grew tired of what she calls "the business of the business" and established herself as a freelance artist. She and her husband created her company, Tarnished Images, in 1991, from which she sold art mainly at science fiction and fantasy conventions.

In 1994, Ruth found Renaissance festivals, which

quickly became her greatest passion. Festivals

represented a living, breathing version of the world she thought lived only in books, art, and her imagination. Since 1994, she has increased her exhibitions at Ren Faires from 1 to 14, with her work displayed year-round, from Arizona to New York. She also has licensed her work to the Excalibur Hotel, Hot Topic clothes, and the Franklin Mint. It was in 1997 that I first encountered Ruth's art. I began living with my life partner and housemate and sharing things we had in common, notably our own individual loves for the genres of science fiction and fantasy. In a moment of happy circumstance, we discovered a print that depicted a dragon standing tall over a female warrior and a male who was perhaps a bard or a wizard. The moment united the three of us, and we chose that art as an iconic representation of

our newly formed family.

In 1998 I joined CONvergence, at which Ruth was the 2000 Artist Guest of Honor. I was elated by the opportunity to meet someone who had created something that meant a lot to me personally, and to my family. The following year I found her booth, Tarnished Images, at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival. Ruth greeted me warmly, and we talked of her excellent experience at CONvergence. She said then that she hoped to come back one day, so when the "Women of Wonder" theme was decided for CONvergence 2012, Ruth came immediately to mind. She was thrilled at the invitation - Ruth has always been appreciative of the fact that we remember her and think of her so fondly. After twelve years and a lifetime of memories, we gladly welcome back our good friend, the amazing artist Ruth Thompson.

SOPHIE ALDRED Introduction by Nick Seidler

Every now and then you encounter an actor or actress that really makes being a sci-fi fan exciting. That's the feeling that I get when I think of Sophie Aldred. She has a genuine love for her career and a true interest in the character that most have us have come to know her for: Ace on Doctor Who!

As the character of Ace, Sophie would help redefine the role of the companion character in the Doctor Who series. Her character, first introduced in the story "Dragonfire" opposite the Seventh Doctor Sylvester McCoy, was a street-smart teenager eager to adventure with the Time Lord from Gallifrey. Spunky and "real," her characterization as a believable modern 1980s teenager guickly made her a fan favorite. In her adventures, Ace would meet Daleks, Cybermen, and work with Brigadier Lethbridge Stewart's UNIT to help the Doctor save the world. The series' storylines featured Ace's character and her personal development prominently. Sophie Aldred's Ace was the companion on the series when the original run ended in 1989 with the story "Survival." Her character's universal appeal to the audience would become the template for the companion Rose when the series returned in 2005. Ask her about her character Ace and she will reveal a love and understanding as if she is the character herself.

But Sophie is not a one-trick pony. Her engaging and warm style of acting has been on display in theater and television, including performances opposite Topol in Fiddler on the Roof, the prime-time soap opera EastEnder, and as a children's TV presenter on various series such as Rainbow and Melvin & Maureen's Musicgrams.

In 1993 she returned to the role of Ace for the BBC's Children in Need charity special in the 3-D special Doctor Who: Dimensions in Time. Not long after the special, Sophie wrote the book Ace!: The Inside Story of the End of an Era about her character, co-authored by the visual effects artist Mike Tucker. The book gave details about the character including the original plans for Ace's departure in what would have been Doctor Who's 27th Season were it produced. It seems she somehow finds herself back in Ace's black bomber jacket one way or



another.

Sophie Aldred married fellow actor Vince Henderson in 1997. She took a break from acting and concentrated on her family. After the birth of her two children, Adam and William, she worked as a teacher in their school. From her career as a children's TV presenter to her work in the classroom, Sophie has always been engaging youth and working to make the world a bit better for others.

In the intervening years she has done a large amount of voice work including series such as Bob the Builder and in the role of Dennis the Menace on the series Dennis and Gnasher. She has also reprised the character of Ace in over 30 Doctor Who audio adventures produced by Big Finish. Her most recent appearance was in the independent film Thriller Theater! (2011) which was filmed in nearby Madison, Wisconsin.

CONvergence is excited to welcome the warm and wonderful Sophie Aldred to our convention and we hope to hear all about her exciting and varied career. Her conversations are engaging and warm, just as we might hope. We expect the experience to be "Ace"!

SHARYN NDVEMBER Introduction by Michael Levy

I first became aware of Sharyn November as an editor of young adult fiction a number of

years ago when her name began appearing repeatedly in conjunction with the books I was reviewing for Publishers Weekly & VOYA. If Sharyn was the editor, it was certain to be a good book at the very least, & more often than not a great one.

Her choices were often gritty, even edgy, books that sometimes challenged the limits of young adult fiction & particularly YA fantasy. Further, she was editing some of the biggest names in the field and, more often than not, getting their best work out of them. It wasn't until years later when I actually met Sharyn, however, that I discovered what an entirely remarkable person she is. We were on a young adult fiction panel at a convention, perhaps WisCon, & I initially found her to be very intimidating.

The first thing you're likely to notice about Sharyn November is that she's beautiful, not perhaps in a conventional sense, but in an eccentric, kinetic, New York Jewish, witty, smart, pre-Raphaelite sense. She's tall, dresses in black flowing skirts & tops, & wears her astonishingly thick mahogany red hair very long. She has a strong jaw & lively eyes. She always seems to be in motion, perhaps overly caffeinated, especially while making some perceptive comment about fantasy literature or young adult publishing. She can easily dominate most conversations if she chooses to, but is equally willing to listen when other people have worthwhile things to say, & she's particularly interested in the opinions of young adults. Now that I've gotten over finding her scary, she's probably my all-time favorite person to share a panel with.

Before becoming an editor, Sharyn was a successful poet, song writer & rock musician. She's now worked at Penguin & its subsidiaries in various editorial capacities



for more than twenty years & is currently both senior editor at Viking Children's Books & editorial director of her own fantasy imprint, Firebird Books, which she founded in 2002. Firebird primarily publishes reprints & reissues but does the occasional

original volume, most importantly, a trio of astonishingly good short story anthologies, Firebirds, the World Fantasy Award-nominated Firebirds Rising, and Firebirds Soaring. Sharyn has also been responsible for convincing a number of important authors of adult fiction to write young adult stories, both in the Firebirds anthologies & at book length. Among the best of these books have been Kelly Link's Pretty Monsters, Elizabeth Hand's Illyria, Ellen Klages's The Green Glass Sea, and John Barnes's Tales of the Madman Underground. Her list of authors, not all of them fantasists, includes Lloyd Alexander, Laurie Halse Anderson, Charles de Lint, Sarah Dessen, Nancy Farmer, Allison Goodman, Hiromi Goto, Nina Kiriki Hoffman, Diana Wynne Jones, Nnedi Okorafor, Meredith Ann Pierce, & Megan Whalen Turner. Her most recent original publications are Elizabeth Hand's wonderful time slip story Radiant Days, and John Barnes's novel Losers in Space. Sharyn is a two time nominee for the World Fantasy Award.

When I asked Sharyn if there were any interesting facts about her that aren't already common knowledge, she asked me to mention that she's always looking for good book recommendations, & that she has a short attention span. Despite the latter, she can take credit for bringing into print a remarkably high percentage of the best Young Adult fantasies of the last twenty years. I hope that you will make a point of attending Sharyn November's panels because she's not only smart & knowledgeable, but also one of the most enjoyable raconteurs you're likely to come across at CONvergence or any other science fiction convention.

THIMITHH PIERCE

In my sophomore year of high school, my feistiest friend loaned me her paperbacks of the *Song of the Lioness Quartet*, and reading it in public was like carrying around a secret handshake. Everywhere I was met by people who loved Tamora Pierce's books. Strangers and schoolmates, with a mix of far-off smiles and bounding excitement and everything in between, would pause to share how much they loved Alanna. When the book in your hands is such a focal point, you know you have found something truly great.



Tamora Pierce has lived nearly as storied a life as any of her characters. She was born in a mining town in Pennsylvania, but has lived on the San Francisco Bay writing her first stories, in Philadelphia rediscovering her talent, and in Upstate New York selling her writing for the first time. In the late '70s, she moved to Idaho where she worked as a housemother in a group home for girls. To these girls she told the story of a heroine, Alanna, who disguised her gender to earn her knighthood and change the world. This retelling of a manuscript Tamora had already written, intended originally as an adult novel, is the birth of Alanna's story as we know it. Tamora rewrote that manuscript for a teenage audience, and Alanna: The First Adventure was published in 1983.


Since the completion of the Song of the Lioness Quartet, Tamora has published 24 more books. Her prolificacy has never come at the expense of character integrity. Though her stories all feature strong characters, they are each unique in background,

motivation, and voice. In addition, Tamora has successfully introduced transgender characters when other publishers are still shying away from gay characters (not for lack of trying on the authors' parts). She presents current issues, like torture and gender inequality, without pulling punches. In her recent anthology, *Tortall and* Other Lands, we find ourselves in a land of deep gender segregation. There, we meet both a woman disguising herself as a man for the freedoms the masquerade offers, and a woman who keeps her veil but teaches others to read and reinterpret the texts preaching that gender divide. Both do so at the ultimate risk to their selves, but during the course of their stories we also learn and consider the hidden costs of their choices. Which is more liberating, the veil or the trousers? Can freedom be found in hiding or anonymity? Can strength?

My feisty friend has always been a bit of a warrior, and I know Tamora's books have contributed to her pursuit of martial arts training. Likewise, when my acrobatics class seems too scary or too painful, I remind myself of Alanna training with a sword two sizes too big, and I push through. All those people who cannot walk past someone with their nose in one of Tamora's books without pausing to cheer have been equally touched. Tamora Pierce did not make us strong; we did that. But she excels at creating worlds where we can be strong, where we can seek adventure and change our own world for the better, and we salute her for it.





None of these films were ever released theatrically in the US.

SANDBOX RULES (YES. IT DOES)

Here at Quantum Sandbox, we have a few rules, follow them to avoid sadness and loss.
