



# **Hotel Occupancy**

We had a very successful occupancy of the hotel this year, despite a few bumps. Over all, we and the hotel are pleased with the relationship with one another. Here are up-and-down highlights: Our Thursday night room block was the best pick-up ever. Night by night, our occupancy in the hotel was thus...


- Wednesday, we occupied 29 rooms, 14 more than in 2001
- Thursday we occupied 119 rooms, approximately 20 more than in 2001
- Friday we occupied 415 rooms, 64 more than in 2001
- Saturday we occupied 427 rooms, approximately 30 more than 2001
- Sunday, we occupied 76 rooms, more than in 2001.

As can be noted from above, we exceeded our room block of 400 rooms per night on Friday and Saturday. There were several unfortunate instances of using Scotch tape, instead of masking tape, for sign hanging. There were a couple of last minute party cancellations, resulting in closed cabana room doors. Our thanks to everyone who elected to take a room in the hotel, and who helped make CONvergence in 2002 a success.

"[Cinema Rex] is by far the best film room in convention history."



Every year we work to make ConSuite better and provide you with a wide variety of snack foods for the weekend. We've expanded our offerings beyond the convention staples of chocolate and chips, to

where it now includes sandwiches, pizza, soups and veggie trays. To make ConSuite best able to serve the largest number of people it's important to remember that the ConSuite's purpose is not to feed you breakfast, lunch and dinner for the entire weekend. We couldn't do that without practically doubling the convention's registration costs.

That's part of why we can't post a schedule of when special treats like pizza or a sandwich bar will be put out. There isn't enough for everyone so it has to be on a first-come / first-served basis for those who stop by at the right time. So feel free to stop by ConSuite often. You never know what surprises you might find.

We are continually trying to improve and build upon the quality and diversity of dealers in the CONvergence Dealers' Room. That diversity is limited to the pool of dealers who request space in our Dealers' Room. As an example, we would love to have an Anime dealer at CONvergence, but have not been able to find one to come to our convention. If there is a specific dealer you want to see at CONvergence, please let us know specifically who they are and how to contact them. and feel free to let them know you'd enjoy seeing them at our convention.

#### Hotel

"The way one must register for a hotel room is too complicated. Make it easier."

- Survey Comment

We actually think the process is pretty simple. We'll try our best to make sure it's understood by everyone. The process is this:

1) Fill out form found on web site or in CONvergence publications.

2) Send in form to MISFITS\CONvergence office.

 Room allocations start in January – Confirmations from the hotel start going out in February. If you haven't heard about your room by March 15, and you sent in a form prior to Feb. 28, please contact the CONvergence Hotel Dept.

# Masquerade / Mainstage

"Also, more seating for the masquerade"

"Better seating/able to see/able to fit everyone in main auditorium"

"More Seating for the masquerade. I didn't get to see it"
"Access to the masquerade – could not get in this year
or last!"

- Survey Comments

There are almost 2000 attendees of CONvergence, and there are only 350 seats. Not everybody will get to see the show. The only fair way to prioritize who gets to see the show is by who's willing to make the commitment to get their early enough to be sure to get in.

"Why isn't masquerade broadcast?"

- Survey Comment

We'd love to broadcast the Masquerade on the hotel television. Unfortunately, this would cost the convention THOUSANDS of dollars that are not currently in the CONvergence budget. We'd love to see it to happen as much as you would and continue to search for a way to make it happen.

"Larger room for opening ceremonies & masquerade"

- Survey Comment

There is no larger room in the hotel. The only way to make more space available for additional mainstage seating would be to eliminate the Dealers' Room, which doesn't seem like much of an option.

"Higher stage for masquerade, etc."

"It's hard to see"

- Survey Comments

Unfortunately, stage height is a function of the hotel's equipment, and not something we have any control over.

"It is silly to make people wait in line for the big events. Open the doors early and let people in."

- Survey Comment

When an event is as popular as the masquerade, crowd management is always an issue. It is not arbitrary when the doors open, they open when the space is *ready*. There are technical requirements that have to be met for any show; beforehand and without people in the way is the best way to do them.

We try to minimize the amount of time people spend waiting for in line for seating or for an event to start. All mainstage events had the doors open for seating on time this year, and the all the events started within five minutes of their scheduled start-time, and we were very proud of that.

#### **Parties**

"Ist floor parties need to open hall doors for wheelchair access."

- Survey Comment

Thank you for mentioning this. We'll address the issue with the parties on the first floor. It is realistically up to each party to determine their individual access needs. While there are limits to what we can do, we will work with the party hosts in an effort to meet this need.

## **Programming**

"More panels on Dr. Who"

"More panels on old tyme stuff - fairy tales, folklore, etc. & relationships to SF/F"

"More Producers/Writers/Directors doing commentary on their movies"

- Survey Comments

Thank you for the clear, actionable suggestions! The Programming Brainstorming Meeting was held on November 16, so the best way now to make sure CONvergence 2003 has the programming you want is to e-mail us with your ideas.

It's important that you let us know what programming you want to see, but even then it takes more than just putting a programming or panel idea in our database. We need volunteers willing to sit panels and make these great programming ideas happen. Let us know if you would be willing to sit a panel or three at CONvergence!

## Registration

"Accept credit cards for registration (especially online)."

"Credit Card for online registration"

"Credit cards for everything."

- Survey Comments

We understand how convenient using a credit card is. But for every use of a credit card, CONvergence gets charged an average 4% of the total amount charged by the credit card company. Using Registration fees as an example, 4% of our total registration fees for this past year would be \$2,236. That's more than the budget for Cinema Rex and Theatre Nippon combined. We believe that money is better used on the convention. And because it is illegal to charge extra for using a credit card, any sort of extra fee or surcharge for registering (or anything else) with a credit card is impossible.

#### **Volunteers**

"15 hours volunteering way too much to get in @ the con - how about some little perk?"

- Survey Comment

Fifteen hours is how many hours are needed to get a volunteer T-shirt. Anybody who volunteers even for even ONE HOUR gets that year's collectible volunteer button and gets invited to the Volunteer Appreciation Party held in late July.

#### Misc. Issues

"I would also like to see the costume/weapons rules posted on the web site so I can plan ahead."

- Survey Comment

We'll make sure that happens.

"More trash cans please."

- Survey Comment

We agree that more would be better. We'll try to get the hotel to have more available.

"Don't put it right on the 4th of July!"

"Don't hold directly on the 4th of July - but I know why it is."

"More cheddar cheese OR have it the last week of June."

"Push the weekend back one weekend - too hard close to the 4th. Thanks for a great con!"

- Survey Comments

To clarify, the convention is held the first weekend in July, so it won't always directly affect July 4th plans. But it often will. There are lots of advantages to holding the convention on a holiday weekend, such as the likelihood that people would have a day off of work to make it easier for them to attend more of a bursting-at-the-seams three-day convention. We know that our date is less than convenient for some of you, but the reality is that there is not date on the calendar we could have picked that wouldn't have been a problem for someone. Overall, the weekend has worked very well for us and CONvergence has no plans to move.


#### SILENT AUCTION

## **ANNUAL THEME**

Our slogan for the 2003 convention is "Time Flies", which reflects an overall theme of time travel. This theme allows us to spotlight decades of time travel stories in science fiction of all media. It also allows us to salute the 40th Anniversary of Doctor Who, and acknowledge our own milestone of the fifth annual CONvergence.

We've been doing more each year to find ways to tie into our annual themes, and we hope to do more than ever next year. We plan to highlight programming and events that tie into our theme with flyers and a special section on the Programming Guide, similar to what we have done in the past for programming featuring any of our Guests of Honor. ## **GUESTS**

#### Eric Flint - Author

Born in southern California in 1947, Eric spent five years living in France before returning to finish high school in Los Angeles and eventually graduating summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from UCLA. Eric Flint had been writing science fiction and fantasy stories for years, but didn't really "buckle down and start writing seriously" until 1992 at age 45. That year he wrote a short story entitled *Entropy, and the Strangler* won first place in the Winter 1992 Writers of the Future contest, which was founded by L. Ron Hubbard. Eric followed that success with a variety of short stories, many of which were in collaboration with long-time writing partner Richard Roach.

Eric's first published novel was *Mother of Demons* for Baen Books in 1993, and was shortly thereafter asked by Jim Baen to collaborate with David Drake on a series of alternate history/military SF novels based on the historical figure of Belisarius. Eric spent most of 1997-1999 writing the

first four books in the Belisarius series (An Oblique Approach, In the Heart of Darkness, Destiny's Shield and Fortune's Stroke). Other collaborations have included Rats, Bats, & Vats and Pyramid Scheme with Dave Freer, and Heirs of Alexandria with Freer and Mercedes Lackey.

Eric went solo again in 1999 with the novel 1632, which spawned sequels to form the ASSITI SHARDS series. Eric also works as an editor, working on reissues of works by James H. Schmitz and Keith Laumer. For more on Eric Flint and a complete listing of his works (including forthcoming releases) visit www.ericflint.net.

#### Simon Jones - Actor

While studying at Cambridge University, Simon Jones met Douglas Adams, forging a lifelong friendship and setting the stage for his most famous role. The role of Arthur Dent in *Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* was written for Jones by Adams, and Jones would play the character in both the original 1978 radio series and the six-episode television version in 1981.

In addition to numerous stage credits, Simon Jones has been busy in television and film, guest starring in TV series ranging from Law & Order: Special Victims Unit and Oz to playing Sir Walter Raleigh in Black Adder. His film appearances include several Terry Gilliam favorites, including 12 Monkeys (1995), Brazil (1985), and Monty Python's The Meaning of Life (1983).

Jones has done extensive radio and voiceover work in addition to Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy, and will be performing as part of the Mark Time Radio Show at CONvergence 2003.

## Phil Hester - Comic Book Creator

Phil Hester has been writing and drawing comic books since 1987 for publishers including DC Comics, Marvel Comics, and Dark Horse, working with some of the most loved characters and most exciting talents in the business. Phil is currently the penciller of the smash-hit revival of DC's *Green Arrow*, which he launched with fan-favorite writer Kevin Smith. Phil is also the creator and writer of *The Coffin* mini-series for Oni Press, which has been optioned by Lightstorm Studios as a feature film to be directed by Guillermo del Toro.

We'll be announcing additional guests in the comings months.

#### **Hotel Information**

For 2003, we will be returning to the Radisson Hotel South and the room process will remain the same. A Room Request Form is included in this booklet, and additional copies are available on our web site. Forms should be completed and returned to the CONvergence hotel department. At the very least, we must have name, address, phone number, smoking and bed preference and check in and check out dates. Please remember that all preferences are allocated on a first come – first served basis. Also note that the Radisson has a limited number of smoking rooms.

Our room block for 2003 is 425 rooms on Friday and Saturday night, and we'd like to fill 450 of that. Once received, we will allocate the room, and forward the request to the Radisson. We expect to forward the first requests starting in January. The Radisson will send confirmations. Once received, they would appreciate having the room guaranteed either by credit card or by a deposit check. If a reservation is cancelled 7 days or more prior to check in, then the refund deposit will be returned. No charges will appear on a credit card until check out. The hotel may elect to charge the first night of stay to a credit card if the party reserving the room fails to show. The hotel may elect to keep the deposit under the same circumstances.

We anticipate beginning to forward request forms to the Radisson in January or February of 2003, and we look forward to seeing you at CONvergence in July! Please send all questions, inquiries, etc. to hotel@convergence-con.com.


