



Registration Totals

We are pleased to state that CONvergence 2005 was our best-attended convention to date, with our registration totals continuing to go up each year.





We already have 884 pre-registered for CONvergence 2006, with 830 of those signing up while attending our 2005 convention.

Demographics

Of the 257 people who filled out convention surveys this year, 147 (57.2%) of them were female and 110 (42.8%) were male, and 41 of them (14.95%) said that 2005 was their first CONvergence. A breakdown of the ages of survey participants is at right. Our thanks go to everyone who filled out a survey and offered feedback on the convention. All the comments were read and discussed by the Convention Committee and Board of Directors, and several of the comments are presented in the following pages of this publication.

Our occupancy of the Sheraton Bloomington, our home for many years, continues to grow. 


Wasn't that fabulous? We hope everyone got a chance to see the star map as it appeared outside of the Science Room in the North Tower over the weekend.





DAVID WEBER

David Weber is often compared to C.S. Forester (the celebrated creator of Captain Horatio Hornblower) and is the recipient of the sort of critical praise once reserved for a Heinlein or an Asimov. His novels range from epic fantasy (Oath of Swords, The War God's Own) to breathtaking space opera (Path of the Fury, The Armageddon Inheritance) to military science fiction with indepth characterization (the celebrated and awesomely popular Honor Harrington series, Ashes of Victory made it to the New York Times bestsellers list, and the latest instalment in the series is War of Honor (2003).)

Of his creation, David Weber said this: "If I had to pick the three characteristics which I think are most central to who Honor Harrington is and to the reason readers respond to her so positively, those characteristics would be

responsibility, compassion, and loyalty. She is not a 'safe' person. She has a ferocious temper which it is very dangerous to arouse, but that dangerous side of her personality is controlled and focused by her sense of compassion and her willingness to assume responsibility for fixing problems, whoever created them. It doesn't matter to Honor whether or not a problem is 'her fault.' What matters to her is that there is a problem which needs to be solved, and she digs in to do just that."

David has collaborated with other authors including David Drake, S. M. Stirling, and CONvergence Guest of Honor Eric Flint, with whom he worked on the novels Warmasters, 1633, and Crown of Slaves.

Miles Teves is a painter and a sculptor working as a conceptual designer for film, television, and computer games. A child of the 60's and 70's, Miles was raised on a steady stream of pop-culture including Godzilla, Batman, Star Trek, Whacky Packages, Plop magazine, old horror and sci-fi films and Monty Python. He began working in the Hollywood entertainment industry in 1984 and has been at it ever since.

In a stroke of fate Rob Bottin hired the young artist to work as a concept illustrator on a landmark fantasy film called 'Legend'. Over the next couple of years, Miles provided character concept art for Explorers, Robocop, The Witches of Eastwick, and Total Recall.

After some time spent pursuing work in the computer game field, Miles returned to conceptual design for film. Since then he has worked on a number of projects including a large number of popular genre films including the following:

GREG WEISMAN

CONvergence is pleased to welcome GARGOYLES creator Greg Weisman to CONvergence 2006. Greg has been a story-teller all his life, working as an Associate Editor and Freelance Writer for DC Comics, where he wrote *Captain Atom* and other titles.

Greg worked at Walt Disney Television Animation from 1989 until 1996, rising through the ranks to become the Director of Series Development for the division. Greg worked on such diverse properties as Darkwing Duck, Gummi Bears, Tail Spin, Bonkers, Raw Toonage, Duck Tales the Movie, Aladdin the Series and The Mighty Ducks, among others.



In 1991, Greg and his team created and developed a new series for Disney:

Gargoyles. Greg left his position as an executive to become the Supervising Producer and Supervising Story Editor of the first 66 episodes of that series. In 1996, Greg left Disney for DreamWorks Television Animation, where he also developed numerous series.

In October of 1998, Greg left DreamWorks to become a full-time Freelance Writer, Story Editor, Producer and Voice Director. He has written scripts for Men In Black, Disney's Hercules, Big Guy & Rusty the Boy

Along with partner and Managing Director Jason Heigh-Ellery, Gary is one of the producers behind *Big Finish Productions*, producers of a large series of science fiction audio stories on CD.

Gary was last with us in 1999, the year of our first convention, when Big Finish was in the process of launching its series of officially licensed *Doctor Who* audio stories, featuring Peter Davison, Colin Baker, and Sylvester McCoy

reprising their roles as the Doctor, along with several original companions. Since then, Big Finish has produced more than 80 *Doctor Who* adventures, including a series of "Eighth Doctor" stories featuring Paul McGann. Many of these stories have been directed by Gary himself.

Big Finish has also produced several Doctor Who spin-off series, including *Dalek Empire, Bernice Summerfield, Gallifrey, Unit,* and *Sarah Jane Smith*, many featuring actors from the original *Doctor Who* TV series reprising their classic roles.

As a note of trivia, Gary is also a former child actor having played leading roles in the BBC's adaptation of E. Nesbit's novel *The Phoenix and the Carpet* and ITV's adaptations of Enid Blyton's *Famous Five* novels. He even had a minor walk-on role in the James Bond movie *Octopussy*.

CONvergence 2006 will see the first major turnover in ConSuite personnel since our convention began. Thaadd Powell and her crew did a great job and they will be missed but with a new staff we have the opportunity to look at the way things have been done and make some major changes.

We recognize the challenge with ConSuite. ConSuite is the one convention department that will never be able to satisfy everyone. Our goal is to ensure that we excel at certain basic priorities this year.

Organization

We want to ensure that the consuite staff is well trained and easy to find. We also want to streamline the food distribution process so we can make sure there is always a good variety of food available.

We have four individuals signed to act as co-heads for the department and are also looking to fill eight subhead spot. During the convention, our goal will be to have one head and two sub-heads on duty at all times.

In addition to these twelve people, we are going to need lots of help! Please contact us if you are interested in volunteering for ConSuite. We will need help with set-up on Thursday, with food distribution, food prep and cleaning throughout the weekend and with tear down on Monday. Remember, if you volunteer for ConSuite, you get first crack at the special food!

We are also looking at a new method of food distribution. Most con-goers will not notice a major difference. What we hope they notice is the fact there is fresher food available and a greater variety of options.

Cleanliness

A frequent complaint about ConSuite is the cleanliness of the rooms. Our new staff is focused on this problem and we have come up with several ideas to ensure the hospitality rooms stay clean and inviting. One area we have looked at is smoking ConSuite and changes to that room are outlined below.

The new plan for food distribution should also help. But there is no substitute for having people on the floor. With three dedicated heads at all times, we feel we will have a strong focus on keeping ConSuite clean and inviting.

Decor

We want ConSuite to reflect the theme of the convention. We also want the interior rooms to be interesting and inviting. Room decor is a big part of that. Look to see a lot more time and thought going into room decor at the convention.

* Party space, that is. Outer space is theoretically infinite.


Programming
