CONvergence is a convention for fans of science fiction and fantasy coming to the Radisson Hotel South in Bloomington, Minnesota, July 2-4, 1999.

CONvergence will feature panels and programming on science fiction and fantasy in several programming tracks. We also feature national and local guests, an art show and auction, a dealers' room, a film room (Cinema Rex), a 24-hour Anime room, open gaming, collectible card tournaments, LARPs, a free coffee shop, room parties, live music, and the Masquerade!

At press time we have just over 750 preregistrations and anticipate an attendance of more than 1,000. That's astounding for a first-year fan-run convention, and we couldn't do it without your help and support.

There is only a short time left to preregister for CONvergence at our \$25 rate. Pre-registration ends on May 31st,

leaving only at-the-door registration at \$40. Supporting memberships are \$10, with an additional \$15 payable at the door. This saves you \$15 over the at-the-door rate!

If you want to know how to pre-register or reserve a hotel room, check out the forms at the back of this Progress Report. Currently, there is still space available in our overflow hotel, the Wyndham Gardens.

Forrest J. Ackerman – Guest of Honor Hugo Award Winner, Sci-Fi Editor/Collector/Historian/Legend

A legend of Science Fiction and Fantasy, the man who coined the term Sci-Fi: The one and only Forrest J. Ackerman is our first CONvergence Guest of Honor.

Forry is a man

of many firsts, including being the winner of the very first Hugo Award (and five more since!). Forry founded Famous Monsters of Filmland in 1958 (which he would continue to write and edit for over 30 years), and has written and edited countless Sci-Fi-related articles and books. Forry has called himself "A sci-fi sponge that should be squeezed for information and anecdotes as long as I'm here." Toward that end, CONvergence is pleased to announce that Forry plans to offer the following panels and readings:

- I Remember Karlon Torgosi: Filmonster Actors I Have Known
- From Scientifiction to Sci-Fi: Asimov to Wells, with Burroughs, Bradbury, Heinlein, et al in between

Gary Russell - Guest of Honor

Doctor Who author/editor, producer of Big Finish Productions' Dr. Who audio series

Gary Russell is a writer and editor who has



enjoyed a long association with Doctor Who, His and partner Jason Haigh-Ellery's Big Finish Productions has been granted the license to produce original audio adventures of

Doctor Who.

Stephen Cole, consulting editor of the BBC Doctor Who books, will act as Executive Producer for the audio series, which will be considered part of the official Doctor Who canon by the BBC.

Peter Davison, Colin Baker, and
Sylvester McCoy have been confirmed to
reprise their roles as the fifth, sixth, and
seventh Doctors in the first release from this
new series, The Sirens of Time, by Nicholas
Briggs. Sirens will be released in the late

spring or early summer, hopefully in time to be available at CONvergence.

Big Hinish Productions already produces audio adventures featuring Benny Summerfield of Virgin's **New Adventures** book series, a spin-off of the Doctor Who novels.

Gary Russell is also the author of several Doctor Who novels, a contributor to the Short Trips anthologies, and writer of the novelization of the 1996 Doctor Who TV movie shown in America on the Fox Network. He has been the editor of Doctor Who Magazine, and produced 20 issues of his fanzine Shada from 1979 to 1995.

CONvergence looks forward to having Gary talk about these productions as well as his new non-fiction Doctor Who book

Regenerations, a look at the production of the 1996 Doctor Who TV movie co-written with TV movie producer Philip Segal.


Pamela Keesey – Author / Editor




Programming runs from 3:00pm to 1:30am Friday, 9:00am to 1:30am Saturday, and noon to 3:00pm Sunday.

The three sections of the CONvergence Art Show will be the **Main Section** (for most artwork), the **Adults-Only Section** (at the discretion of the artist or Art Show Head), and the **Print Shop**. Artwork may be offered for sale or displayed as "Not for Sale." Works receiving more than five bids will be entered into the Art Auction.

Artwork will be displayed on 4'x6' pegboard panels for flat art, on table space for 3-dimensional pieces, and in a display case for small sculptures and pewelry.

Hanging/Display Space is \$5 per half-panel or fialf-table. \$10 per whole-pPanel or whole-table. No hanging fees are charged for Print Shop items. The maximum space allowed is a combination of two whole-panels/tables of space covering no more than \$0 square feet. The charge for placing small items in the display case is \$0 cents per piece. CONvergence receives a 10% commission on all art sold through the Art Show and Print Shop.

Security will be provided by CONvergence while the Art Show is in session. The Art Show space will be locked at night. This is not a guarantee of safety but an honest attempt to be secure.






