



We want to make it easy for you to join us at CONvergence 2002. This final Progress Report before our 2002 convention has all the information you need to attend and participate in what we hope will be our best convention yet.

This year's convention is dedicated to the *Indiana Jones* trilogy and the brand of high adventure those films represent. You'll be seeing a lot of Indy sprinkled throughout our publications this year and in our programming at the convention. Don't think that means that Indy is all CONvergence 2002 will be about. Pre-Registration

You can pre-register for CONvergence for only \$35 until May 15, 2002. After that, you'll have to register at the door for \$50, so pre-register now and save! See the registration form on the inside back cover of this Progress Report for more details.


When you receive your reservation confirmation, please review them carefully and advise CONvergence of any necessary changes.



Be sure to mention ART SHOW in the subject line. As always, we will be looking for volunteers to help us run the art show and auction. We'll need volunteers for badging, coat check, and more. Please contact us if you'd like to help.

We'd like to remind you in advanced of some of our rules and policies. In the interests of protecting the artwork in our care, the following items will need to be checked at the door.

- No purses, bags, backpacks, fanny-packs, or containers of any kind. Base rule: If a bag is LARGER than our SMALLEST piece of inventory it must be checked.
- 2. No staffs, canes, swords, scabbards or anything else we deem to be a potential danger to the artwork.
- 3. No cameras, camcorders, scanners, or any kind of electronic media storage device of any size at all.







Art & Comics: It's a line! It's a shadow! It's The Shadow! It's Art and Comics! Since man first drew on a cave wall, we've been moved and inspired by art. Comics have been called everything from drivel, to legends of the 20th Century. Panels will cover topics all through the spectrum of these two diverse media.

Science & Technology: Formerly "Hard Science", we changed the name because science isn't necessarily hard – it can be fun and accessible to everybody. We cover all aspects of science and tech, from discussions of the Probability Machine to nanotech, from fire to nuclear fusion.
